TACTICAL/SURVIVAL

- **Ambush Survival Tactics**

Trainer: Rad Training Inc

Date: April 1, 2020 → 8:00 am – 5:00 pm

Description: This course is for certified law enforcement officers. Classroom training alone is not enough. Patrol officers need hands on training. Knowing when to escalate and de-escalate during unknown and violent encounters is paramount for officers and is often overlooked. This course is designed with minimal classroom and maximum realistic scenario-based training. The following are topics covered during this training course:

- Techniques for mental and physical peak performance to win
- Less lethal and deadly force decision making through scenario-based training
- Techniques for vehicle encounters that turn violent
- Close quarter shooting tactics
- Techniques for deliberate ambush
- Escalation and de-escalation techniques through reality-based scenario training
- Responding to and dealing with an armed subject
- Approaches; Cover vs Concealment
- Rescue carries and extraction techniques
- Operational Life Saver Training for law enforcement first responders, based on the Tactical Emergency Casualty Care (TECC) concept

- **The Israeli Security Model: Lesson Learned**

Description: This course introduces students to the Israeli Security Model and how it has evolved over the years in response to external threats. Israel has more experience than any other nation in dealing with terrorist attacks. As a result, the lessons learned by Israel has resulted in a highly successful security model that addresses three critical elements: prevention, response and recovery. Israel has learned that having a quick, aggressive response to a threat, while important, is insufficient by itself; it is far better to detect and prevent an attack before it ever happens. Israel has also learned that recovery following an attack must be accomplished quickly in order to restore public confidence and morale. This course will examine each of the three elements of the Israeli Security Model and how they may be applied by US law enforcement.

- **Lottery Crimes-Identifying Fraud through the Use of Image Analysis and Tracking of Tickets**

Description: Lottery tickets are like money and subjects will find ways to beat the system. Lottery Special Agents through Forensic Analysis identify fraud activity. Special Agents utilize Lottery resources to track stolen tickets in addition to assisting law enforcement agencies solve cases involving Florida Lottery tickets. This course will provide an overview of Lottery Crimes and functions of Special Agents within the Florida Lottery.

- **Detecting Deception**
